INFORMATION

I, Detective Constable Kristy DEVINE, of the City of Toronto in the Province of Ontario, a peace officer employed by the Toronto Police Service, make affirmation and say as follows:

1. I understand that this is an *ex parte* application and that I am obligated to provide full, frank and fair disclosure of the material and information available to me. In drafting this Affidavit, I did not include every single detail of the investigation, which I believe does not impact on the sufficiency of the material and information I am presenting. I did not report on peripheral details to matters being investigated. Many reports I read contained more information than I have included in this Affidavit. In an effort to prepare a document that is clear and concise, I have included information that I believe is relevant to this particular investigation and which is necessary to establish the grounds for granting the requested

Authorization. I am aware of my duty to present information that would detract from my grounds.

2. I have reasonable grounds to believe that the death of Honey SHERMAN on or about December 15th, 2017 was the result of a First Degree Murder. Honey SHERMAN was located inside her home located at 50 Old Colony Road, alongside her deceased husband Bernard SHERMAN. The circumstances and evidence located at the scene and the investigation into their deaths thus far, and provided further in the affidavit, has led me to this belief.
3. I am seeking authorization to search Honey SHERMAN and Bernard SHERMAN's cellular phones and computers as well as production orders for their phone records. I believe these items will afford evidence of the offence.

INTRODUCTION OF THE AFFIANT

1. I, Detective Constable Kristy DEVINE #9132, am presently employed by the Toronto Police Service. I have been a member of this service since December 2005. I am currently assigned to the *Homicide Squad* where I perform my duties in a plainclothes capacity. The primary purpose of this unit is to conduct investigations of homicides, suspicious deaths and found human remains within the City of Toronto.
2. During this investigation, I have been assigned to Investigative Team #5. I perform my duties with the following team members:

3. To support this affidavit I am relying on information from the following sources:
 - a. Direct knowledge.
 - b. Interviews that have been conducted by me and by fellow police officers.
 - c. Information passed on to me by other officers based on their observations and interviews they have conducted.
 - d. Affidavits, written reports and memorandum book notes authored by Police Officers and subject matter that I have read.
 - e. Enquiries made through Police databases and other external inquiries.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

4. On Friday December 15th, 2017 the Toronto Police Service received a radio call to attend 50 Old Colony Road, in the City of Toronto in regards to a 911 call. Police attended and located Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN in the basement of their home next to their indoor pool. Both Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN were facing the wall in a semi sitting position. Their arms were behind them, but not bound. Two black belts were seen looped around their necks and the other end of the belts had been attached to a railing [REDACTED]

9. **Production Order (Cellular Phone Numbers belonging to Honey SHERMAN and Bernard SHERMAN).**
 - a. There are two (2) cellular telephone numbers associated to this Production Order – [REDACTED]
 - i. [REDACTED] is associated to Bernard SHERMAN (the Deceased Person).
 - ii. [REDACTED] is associated to Honey SHERMAN (the Deceased Person).
 - b. Telecommunication services for these phone numbers are provided by **Rogers, Communications Canada Incorporated**. As a result, records for these phone numbers are held by, and in control of **Rogers, Communications Canada Incorporated**.

11. **Search Warrant (Cellular phones and other electronic devices belonging to Honey SHERMAN and Bernard SHERMAN)**
- a. There are two (2) cellular telephone phones associated to this search warrant, as well as a Toshiba Laptop, (2) Apple IPADs, and an HP Computer –
 - b. The **Black Blackberry** Cellular phone is associated to Bernard SHERMAN (the Deceased Person).
 - c. The **White Apple I-Phone** Cellular phone is associated to Honey SHERMAN (the Deceased Person).

- d. The **Toshiba Laptop** was located at 50 Old Colony Road, in the City of Toronto.
- e. The two **(2) Apple IPAD's** that were located at 50 Old Colony Road, in the City of Toronto.
- f. One **HP Computer** that was located at 50 Old Colony Road, in the City of Toronto.
- g. In this Search Warrant application, I seek records ("the Data") contained within the two (2) cellular phones the **Black Blackberry** Cellular phone and the **White Apple I-Phone**, as well as ("the Data") on the **Toshiba Laptop, (2) Apple IPADs**, and **an HP Computer** as well as any other electronic devices located inside the residence located at 50 Old Colony Road, in the City of Toronto. These items have been seized from the residence, and are being held in a secured locker at the Forensic Identification Services building located at 2050 Jane Street, in the City of Toronto.
 - i. For these cellular phones, and the additional electronic devices located the following categories of are sought:
 - a. Data relating to use, ownership and access to the devices.
 - b. Data relating to the configuration of the devices, including internal and external system or program configuration.
 - c. Emails sent and received. **(For the period of December 1st, 2017 to December 15th, 2017)**
 - d. Text messages sent and received. **(For the period of December 1st, 2017 to December 15th, 2017)**
 - e. Call logs. **(For the period of November 15th, 2017 to December 15th, 2017)**
 - f. Internet access history showing websites visited including social media. **For the period of December 1st, 2017 to December 15th, 2017)**

- g. Contacts, addresses and phone books.
- h. Any other text documents and notes created or edited.
(For the period of December 1st, 2017 to December 15th, 2017)

Search Warrant Terms and Conditions

- h. The examination and analysis of the mobile devices, electronic devices and any storage device(s) referred to in this document will be based on the offences set out in this warrant and the categories of data listed above.
- i. The examination and analysis will be conducted by members of the Toronto Police Service Technological Crime Unit. These members are Certified Forensic Computer Examiners who will search and extract the data contained within the device(s) using computer forensic software that allows for the search and extraction of data from these items without modifying, destroying or damaging any of the data.

INVESTIGATION & GROUNDS TO BELIEVE

- 12. On Friday December 15th, 2017 I was a part of an "On-Call" team for the Toronto Police Homicide Squad. At approximately 3:20 PM, I was advised by Detective Jeffery TAVARES of two suspicious deaths which had occurred in 33 Division in the City of Toronto and to attend the division located at 50 Upjohn Rd, in Toronto.
- 13. On Saturday December 16th, 2017 at 8:00 AM I arrived at 50 Upjohn Rd (33 Division), and began to investigate.

14. Upon arriving I reviewed I/CAD Reports¹ 2017-3201016, and 2017-3200639. These reports were created by Toronto Police Service dispatchers in relation to a 911 call which initiated an “Echo Tiered Response”. This incident occurred on December 15th, 2017. As a result of reviewing these reports I learned the following information:
- a. At approximately 11:45am on December 15th, 2017, Toronto Police Service dispatchers received an emergency call in relation to an “Echo Tiered Response” incident which had occurred at 50 Old Colony Road in the City of Toronto.
 - b. Elise STERN² called 911. She advised the following;
 - i. She is a Real Estate Agent
 - ii. She located two (2) victims and believed someone has killed her clients.
(believed to be Honey SHERMAN and Bernard SHERMAN)
 - iii. She could be heard yelling “They are dead”.
 - c. The dispatcher could hear other people on-scene trying to help and made note of the commotion in the text of the dispatched call.
 - d. Joseph COHEN called 911. He advised the following;
 - i. He indicated he was a cousin to the wife of the owner of the home.
 - ii. He received a call from his friend telling him to attend the home.
 - iii. He advised that he was approximately 12 minutes away from the home.
 - e. Clair BANKS called 911. She advised the following;
 - i. She indicated she was the gardener.
 - ii. She called 911 to ask if help was on the way.
 - iii. She advised that “they” *(believed to be Honey SHERMAN and Bernard SHERMAN)*
[REDACTED]
 - iv. She advised that “they” *(believed to be Honey SHERMAN and Bernard SHERMAN)* were hung, something against the railing, lying side by side³.

¹ Information - Computer Assisted Dispatch System (*I/CAD*) A computer system used to assist with dispatching radio calls for service responded to by the Toronto Police Service. As a call for service is received by the Toronto Police Service Communications department, an event and an associated numeric event number is generated. Each event includes the date the call for service was made; caller information such as name, address, telephone number, and call source; details of the particular event such as dates, relevant times, and location of the incident(s); events cross-referenced by way of the event number. I/CAD Event reports including all the above mentioned information are generated and can be accessed by members of the Toronto Police Service.

- v. She advised the best entrance was the front door, she did not see anyone else.
- vi. She advised she believes they are deceased, and will not be performing CPR.
- f. Nelia NACACANGAY called 911. She advised the following;
 - i. She is the cleaning lady.
 - ii. She advised that she arrived at 8:30am to exercise with her friend.
 - iii. She thought the clients (*believed to be Honey SHERMAN and Bernard SHERMAN*) were sleeping, so she didn't bother to check the pool area.
- g. At approximately 11:56am, the two people were located by Constable Lesley-Anne HENRY⁴ and Constable Kristina MEHAK⁵ without vital signs.

DESCRIPTION OF SCENE

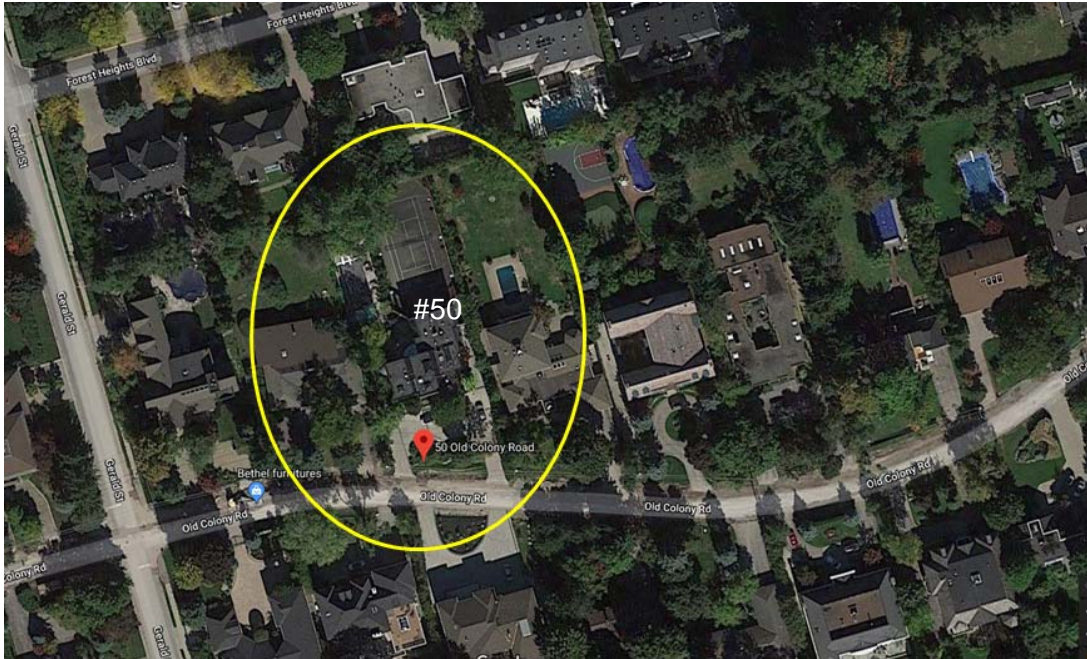
- 15. 50 Old Colony Road is a detached home located in a high end residential area. It is south of Highway 401, north of York Mills Rd, west of Leslie St and east of Bayview Ave in the City of Toronto.
- 16. The home was listed for sale on MLS⁶ C3994621. It was listed as a single family, freehold 2 story home with a garage. The land size is listed as 105.46x256.25 FT. The listing price for this property was \$6,988,000 Canadian Dollars.

⁷ **Google Maps** is a Web-based service developed by Google, and provides detailed information about geographical regions and sites around the world. 17. I also reviewed the *Initial Officer Report* which was contained within a VERSADEx⁸ report 2017-3201016 that had been prepared by Constable Felice BUCCIERI⁹. I learned the following:

- a. Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN (the Deceased Persons) were located in the basement, inside the indoor pool area, of their home which is located at 50 Old Colony Road, in the City of Toronto.
- b. Constable Felice BUCCIERI described the location of the deceased persons as “located at the furthest end of the pool, facing away from the pool and toward the wall. Both bodies had what appeared to be a black belt tied around their necks. The other end of each belt was tied around the pool railing. Both bodies appeared to be in a semi sitting position, [REDACTED]
[REDACTED]
- c. Bernard SHERMAN (February 25th, 1942) was identified by Elise STERN.
- d. Honey SHERMAN (January 25th, 1947) was identified by Elise STERN.

18. On December 16th, 2017 I reviewed Police Constable Lesley-Anne HENRY’s memobook notes; she was one of the first Officers on the scene. I learned the following:

- a. At 2:55 PM the Coroner Dr. GIDDENS¹⁰ pronounced Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN deceased, he ordered an autopsy for both Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN.
- b. She stayed with Honey SHERMAN and Bernard SHERMAN until they were transferred to the Forensic Services and Coroner's Complex (FSCC) located at 25 Morton Shulman Avenue, in the City of Toronto.

19. I reviewed photographs on Cumulus¹¹ taken of the scene by Detective Constable Xu WU¹², Detective Constable Irvin ALBRECHT¹³ and Detective Constable Scott GRONDIN¹⁴ of the Forensic Identification Services section. These photographs were taken at 50 Old Colony Road and 25 Morton Shulman Avenue, in the City of Toronto.
20. On December 16th, 2017 I spoke to Detective Jeff Tavares¹⁵. He provided a cellular phone number for each of the Deceased Persons, which he received from Brad KRAWCYK¹⁶
- a. Cellular phone associated to Bernard SHERMAN – [REDACTED]
 - b. Cellular phone associated to Honey SHERMAN – [REDACTED]
21. On December 17th, 2017 I attended [REDACTED] in the City of Toronto and spoke to Nelia MACADANGAY¹⁷ and I learned the following:
- a. Honey SHERMAN uses a **white I-Phone** with [REDACTED]
 - i. [REDACTED]

23. On December 19th, 2017 I received an email from Detective Brandon PRICE. It was sent originally from Detective Constable Paul SOUCY¹⁹. I learned the following:
- a. Several Items were located inside the residence located at 50 Old Colony Road, in the City of Toronto. This property was seized and now is located in a secured locker #57, located at the Forensic Identification Service located at 2050 Jane Street, in the City of Toronto.

Information Learned from Civilian Witnesses

24. On December 16th, 2017 I spoke to Detective Constable Kristin THOMAS²⁰. She advised that she spoke to Elise STERN²¹. During the conversation she learned the following:
- a. Elise STERN advised that both Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN are on the title and are the owners of 50 Old Colony Rd, in the City of Toronto.
 - b. Elise STERN advised that she is one of two agents who have the house listed for sale.
 - c. Elise STERN advised the other agent is Judi GOTTLIEB²².

25. On December 16th, 2017 I reviewed a statement supplementary report completed by Detective Constable Kristin THOMAS. She conducted an interview with Megan YOUNG²³ and learned the following:
- a. Megan was hired as Bernard and Honey SHERMAN's personal trainer in August 2016.
 - b. Megan attended the address at 50 Old Colony Road on Fridays at 830 am on a weekly basis to train both unless they are away or cancel.
 - c. She refers to Bernard as 'Barry'²⁴, and always has him slotted from 830am to 930am .
 - d. Megan trains Honey (*Honey SHERMAN*) for approximately 2 hours starting at 930am
 - e. Megan explains that she usually gets to the address around 820am and waits for either 'Barry' to exit the premise to get the morning paper to let her in, or for the house keeper to arrive to start her day at 830 am.
 - f. Megan explains that 'Barry' has the same routine every Friday and will generally come outside to retrieve the newspaper. He will unlock the side entrance for her so she can go inside.
 - g. On Friday, December 15th Megan attended the SHERMAN's address.
 - h. When Megan arrived, she noticed a van waiting in the driveway with who she believed was the heating guy or someone there to do some type of work on the home.
 - i. Megan told the officer that the house keeper 'Nelia' (*believed to be Nelia MACADANGAY*) arrived at 830am, and she followed her into the home.
 - j. Megan said that when they got to the side entrance, [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] Megan went to the kitchen to sit and wait for 'Barry'.

- k. Megan observed Nelia let the heating guy into the home and she never saw him again.
 - l. After waiting for a short time and knowing it was out of the ordinary for 'Barry' to not come down for his routine work out, Nelia the house keeper told Megan she would go look for the couple upstairs. Upon her return, she informed Megan they were not home.
 - m. Megan assumed the couple had left for Florida early and left.
 - n. Megan told the officer that she was aware that Honey was leaving for Florida on Sunday December 17th, because she had received an email from Honey on Tuesday December 12th regarding the travel plans. Megan was told by Honey that she and Barry would work out on the Friday December 15th, but she would be leaving for Florida on the Sunday.
 - o. Megan told the officer that Honey had booked one more day for Barry to work on the following Friday, the 22nd and then they would not be rescheduled again until January the 19th 2018.
 - p. Megan understood the Sherman's (*believed to be Honey SHERMAN and Bernard SHERMAN*) were returning on the 12th of January and they would carry on with their regular work outs when they returned.
26. On December 16th 2017, Detective Constable Kristin THOMAS conducted an interview with Roman BUKOVYNSKY²⁵. I have learned the following:
- a. Roman is an Architectural Design and Interior Design Architect.
 - b. Roman was hired by Custom Homes Inc. approximately 1 year ago to assist with the planning of a new home Honey and Barry SHERMAN were planning on purchasing land for and building.
 - c. Roman met Honey (*Honey SHERMAN*) for the first time with her sister Mary SCHECHTMAN²⁶ and the Custom Home Inc. colleagues Joe BRENNEN²⁷ and Daniel GREENGLASS²⁸ at their office in Toronto.

- d. Roman explained to the officer that Mary SCHECHTMAN had a huge hand in the decision making for the planning of the home and he recalls seeing Honey mainly with her sister present over 'Barry' SHERMAN.
- e. Roman continued to meet over the course of the year with the Honey with the design team at various locations, including the SHERMAN's home at 50 Old Colony Road.
- f. Roman explained that he really didn't see much of Barry over the course of the year but he was included whenever there were big decisions that included the larger financial burdens of the build or major interior design decisions.
- g. Approximately 6 months ago, when things were progressing and the land was purchased, the meetings began to occur once a week.
- h. Roman says that when Barry was present during the meetings he was friendly and respectful. He always had his own input and assisted with providing his own opinions about any design issues.
- i. On Wednesday December 13th, Roman attended APOTEX²⁹ with Joe BRENNON and Daniel GREENGLASS from Custom Homes Inc.
- j. They had an appointment for 5pm to meet with Barry and Honey SHERMAN.
- k. Roman said this was the first time they ever met at APOTEX and they were only going there because Barry had to work late and Honey made the arrangements for them to meet there.
- l. Roman said he had received an email from Honey advising where the meeting was going to be earlier in the day.
- m. Roman said he met with Daniel and Joe at their office and they drove up to APOTEX head office together in one car

- n. When they arrived at APOTEX they were let in by the staff there and they were taken to a boardroom. Barry was there to greet them but Honey was running late
- o. Roman said Honey arrived a few minutes after them and he was there to observe and take notes during the meeting.
- p. Roman told the officer the meeting was over the final plans of the home and they discussed the windows and doors with the SHERMAN's and other important decisions regarding the interior. They were hiring a lot of the subcontractors now and needed to discuss everything that was happening with the SHERMAN's home.
- q. Roman said Barry was very involved with the decisions and made comments about how he preferred the sliding glass doors over French doors when they were reviewing the designs.
- r. He also heard Barry making comments about how it was such a large home and why were they making such a large place when he probably only had another 10 or so years left to live.
- s. Roman felt Barry was acting himself and didn't appear stressed or unhappy. He had met Barry on other occasions during their scheduled meetings and Barry seemed the same as he always was
- t. They discussed the next meeting that was going to take place in the weeks to come and he recalls they even planned another meeting with Barry.
- u. Roman told the officer that the meeting was approximately 1 hours and he left with Joe and Daniel. They were escorted out by the Sherman's but Barry stayed to work, and Honey walked them to the parking lot.
- v. Honey left in her own vehicle.
- w. Roman is self-employed and his company is named R.Y.B Design
- x. Roman works closely with Joe/Daniel (*believed to be Joe BRENNON and Daniel GREENGLASS*) (Brennan Custom Homes Inc.)
- y. He was hired by Joe (*believed to be Joe BRENNON*) to work on the home

- z. He has been an architect for 16 years
- aa. He has known Honey and Barry for just over a year.
- bb. He only has a business relationship with the couple due to the 20 million dollar home they are building in Forest Hill
- cc. He has done all the drawings and plans for the design.

Results from Bernard SHERMAN's Autopsy

27. On December 16th, 2017, I reviewed a Supplementary Report prepared by Detective Constable Sarath Thayalan³⁰ concerning the results of Bernard SHERMAN's autopsy. I learned the following:

- a. On December 16th, 2017, Dr. Michael PICKUP³¹, of the Ontario Forensic Pathology Service and Office of the Chief Coroner performed an autopsy on Bernard SHERMAN (born 1942-02-25).
- b. The autopsy was performed at the Forensic Services and Coroners' Complex located at 25 Morton Shulman Avenue, Toronto, Ontario.
- c. Dr. Michael PICKUP advised the following preliminary findings pertaining to Bernard SHERMAN:
 - i. Cause of Death was Ligature Neck Compression.

Results from Honey SHERMAN's Autopsy

28. On December 17th, 2017, Dr. Michael PICKUP, of the Ontario Forensic Pathology Service and Office of the Chief Coroner performed an autopsy on Honey SHERMAN (born 1947-01-25).

- a. The autopsy was performed at the Forensic Services and Coroners' Complex located at 25 Morton Shulman Avenue, Toronto, Ontario.

b. Dr. Michael PICKUP advised the following preliminary findings pertaining to Honey SHERMAN:

i. Cause of Death was Ligature Neck Compression.

29. On December 17, 2017 Detective Sergeant Susan GOMES³² spoke to Dr. Michael PICKUP, the forensic pathologist. Dr. Michael PICKUP completed the post mortem examinations of both Honey SHERMAN and Bernard SHERMAN and advised the following;

i. Honey SHERMAN's cause of death was that of ligature neck compression.

30. On December 16th, 2017 Detective Brandon PRICE³³ advised that he spoke to Dr. Michael PICKUP who performed the autopsies of both Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN. During the conversation he learned the following:

a. There are still three (3) possible outcomes in relation to this investigation;

i. A double suicide

ii. A murder suicide

iii. A double murder

Background of the Two (2) Deceased Persons

31. On December 16th, 2017 I reviewed *Background Reports*³⁴, prepared by Detective Constable Kristin THOMAS, about the Deceased Persons Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN. I have learned the following:

a. **Bernard, C, SHERMAN** (born 1942-02-25) is also known as Barry SHERMAN.

i. Information learned from MTO³⁵

1. The deceased has a valid Ontario Driver's Licence [REDACTED]

- iv. The Deceased does not have a Possession and Acquisition Licence (commonly referred to a firearms licence).
- v. Honey SHERMAN is Bernard SHERMAN's wife.

GROUND TO BELIEVE THE OFFENCE WAS COMMITTED

32. I have reasonable grounds to believe that the offence of Murder was committed on Honey SHERMAN, based on the following grounds:

- a. Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN were pronounced deceased inside their home located at 50 Old Colony Road, in the City of Toronto.
- b. The bodies of Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN were located in the basement of their home next to their indoor pool.
- c. Both Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN were facing the wall in a semi sitting position. Their arms were behind them, but not bound.
- d. Two black belts were seen looped around their necks and the other end of the belts had been attached to a railing [REDACTED]

33. At this point in the investigation it is unclear if the death of Bernard SHERMAN was a suicide, or a murder. The death is suspicious in that [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] There has been no reason uncovered that would lead investigators to believe that this was a suicide alone. Bernard SHERMAN appears to have led a fulfilling life, with no mental health issues or illnesses. There are no domestic related occurrences filed with the Toronto Police Service between Bernard and Honey SHERMAN. He had scheduled a trip to Florida with his wife Honey SHERMAN after the incident took place, and there were no significant changes in his schedule prior to his death. Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN were in the process of breaking ground and building a \$20 million dollar home. Barry SHERMAN did not want to move as he mentioned to a witness and told them he probably only has about 10 more years to live. There has been no suicide note located.

34. I acknowledge the above mentioned three (3) possible outcomes made by Dr. Michael PICKUP in regards to Honey SHERMAN's death one of which is a suicide. After reviewing the existing evidence in its totality; I believe that Honey SHERMAN [REDACTED]

I believe she [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I do not believe with these injuries that she

would have taken her own life. She had a scheduled trip to Florida with her husband Bernard SHERMAN after the death occurred. Investigation has not revealed any mental health issues, or illnesses. There are no domestic related occurrences filed with the Toronto Police Service. There were no significant changes in her schedule prior to her death. There has been no suicide note located. I believe that Honey SHERMAN was murdered.

GROUND TO BELIEVE THAT THE DATA SOUGHT WILL BE IN THE LOCATION TO BE SEARCHED

35. The Toronto Police Service maintains an office that liaises with cellular telephone service providers to fulfill requests from investigators. Members of this unit have been in contact with the Law Enforcement Support section of Rogers Communications Canada Incorporated and confirmed that cellular telephone numbers [REDACTED] [REDACTED] which, are owned and operated by **Rogers Communications Canada Incorporated**. Furthermore, the cellular telephone numbers were active at the time of the deaths and that Rogers Communications Canada retains their records for thirteen (13) months.

- a. Among the records retained by Rogers Communications Canada Incorporated are:
 - i. Account subscriber records for cellular telephone numbers, including data specifying the account's start date, end date, subscriber status, International Mobile Equipment Identity (IMEI) number, last name, first name, address etc.
 - ii. Data related to past and present phone numbers associated to the account holder(s) a specified account.
 - iii. Billing and/or financial accounting and payment information, records, bills, invoices and receipts related to the purchase and sale of the air or talk time.
 - iv. Call/Event detail records (date, time, involved phone numbers, involved phone IMEIs, terminating number, call duration, forwarded number,

routing cell towers, SMS/MMS message metadata, and data use metadata, cellular tower information (tower location, sector, frequency etc.), and subscriber information for the other party in calls and/or text messages who are also Rogers Communication Canada Incorporated customers.

- v. I also learned that Rogers Communication Canada Incorporated retains their records at the following address:

Rogers Communication Canada Incorporated, located at 350 Bloor Street East, Toronto Ontario, M4W 0A1.

36. The Toronto Police Service maintains an office that liaises with service providers to fulfill requests from investigators. Members of this unit have been in contact with the Law Enforcement Support section of Rogers Communications Canada Incorporated and confirmed that email address [REDACTED] which, is owned and operated by **Rogers Communications Canada Incorporated**. Furthermore, the email address was actively being used at the time of the death and that Rogers Communications Canada retains their records.

- a. Among the records retained by Rogers Communications Canada Incorporated are:

- i. Account subscriber records for the email address. Records include the account start date, account end date, last name, first name, and complete address related to the account associated to the email address.
- ii. Any available event detail record (date, time, recipient/sender email addresses for all incoming and outgoing emails and email content for all incoming and outgoing emails.)
- iii. I also learned that Rogers Communication Canada Incorporated retains their records at the following address:

Rogers Communication Canada Incorporated, located at 350 Bloor Street East, Toronto Ontario, M4W 0A1.

- b. On December 19th, 2017 I received an email forwarded by Detective Brandon PRICE, which was sent by Detective Constable Paul SOUCY to Detective Brandon PRICE on December 18th, 2017. In this email Detective Constable Paul SOUCY identified a seizure of the **Black Blackberry** Cellular phone, **White Apple I-Phone**, the **Toshiba Laptop, (2) Apple IPADs**, and **an HP Computer** which were located at 50 Old Colony Rd, in the City of Toronto. These items have been seized from the residence, and are being held in a secured locker #57 at the Forensic Identification Services building located at 2050 Jane Street, in the City of Toronto.

GROUND TO BELIEVE THAT THE DATA SOUGHT WILL AFFORD EVIDENCE

Determination of Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN's Cellular Telephone Numbers

37. On December 16th, 2017 I spoke to Detective Jeff Tavares⁴¹. He provided a cellular phone number for each of the Deceased Persons, which he received from Brad KRAWCYK⁴²
- a. Cellular phone associated to Bernard SHERMAN – [REDACTED]
 - b. Cellular phone associated to Honey SHERMAN – [REDACTED]
38. I confirmed that cellular telephone numbers [REDACTED] are owned and operated by **Rogers Communications Canada Incorporated**.
- a. The cellular phone associated to Bernard SHERMAN – [REDACTED] is registered to Apotex⁴³. Bernard SHERMAN held the title of founder and Chairman of the Board for the Apotex Group of Companies.

- b. The cellular phone associated to Honey SHERMAN – [REDACTED] is registered to Apotex. Honey SHERMAN is Bernard SHERMAN's wife. Bernard SHERMAN held the title of founder and Chairman of the Board for the Apotex Group of Companies.

Determination of Honey SHERMAN's email Address

39. On December 16th, 2017 I reviewed a statement supplementary report completed by Detective Constable Kristin THOMAS. She conducted an interview with Megan YOUNG⁴⁴. During the interview she learned the following:
 - a. Megan YOUNG corresponds with Honey SHERMAN directly via email whenever they schedule, make changes or cancel appointments.
 - b. Megan YOUNG received her last email from Honey SHERMAN on Tuesday, December 12th, at 1:40 pm regarding the December training schedule.
40. I confirmed that the email address [REDACTED] is owned and operated by **Rogers**, and held **Rogers Communications Canada Incorporated**.
 - a. [REDACTED] is a personal email associated to and used by Honey SHERMAN.

Investigative and Evidentiary Value of the Records Being Sought

41. I believe Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN's cellular phone records, in relation to phone numbers [REDACTED] the data contained within the **White I-Phone, Black Blackberry, Toshiba Laptop, (2) Apple IPADs, and an HP Computer** inside their home and Honey SHERMAN's email address [REDACTED] [REDACTED] will afford data of evidentiary value in the following ways:
 - a. Detailed telephone records, call logs and email records will assist investigators in determining who Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN were in contact with leading up to their deaths. Learning who Bernard SHERMAN and Honey

SHERMAN were in contact with may help uncover further witnesses or people with knowledge that will assist the homicide investigation.

- b. Acquiring and analyzing cell tower records will assist in a similar manner to call records – by giving geolocation data for the cellular phone (and through it, its user). Knowing where the Deceased Person's cellular telephones were in the days, hours and minutes leading up to their deaths and will assist in forming patterns of behaviour in their movements. This information may allow investigators to determine factors which contributed to the Deceased Person's deaths.
- c. Billing, payment and accounting information, including subscriber information, will provide information as to who is ultimately responsible for the cellular telephone's use and email's use.
- d. These phone records, the data contained on the two (2) cellular phones, electronics located in the home and email records are potentially the only source of data that will help the investigators determine who Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN were communicating with prior to their deaths.
- e. For text messages and emails, I am cautious about the privacy interests of third parties, but I believe that emails for fourteen (14) days prior to the deaths will reveal whether there was any new cause of stress, or tension between the couple or any third party. I know from the statement of Megan YOUNG that Honey SHERMAN scheduled all her appointments through email.
- f. For the internet history, suicide by one or both of the deceased is a significant possibility in this case. If that is what happened, I would expect to find internet search history suggestive of suicidal thoughts or plans in the short time preceding their deaths.
- g. For contacts, addresses and phone books knowing the associates of the deceased will help us interpret the telephone records to be obtained through the search of Rogers records. This will also help reveal additional people who may provide information in relation to this investigation.

- h. Text documents or notes. Since suicide by one or both deceased is a possibility, I think it is important to check for a “goodbye letter” or suicide note that might have been drafted in the recent past.
- i. Data relating to use, ownership, access to the devices and to their configuration. We need to find not just incriminating or exculpatory information that helps to show who used the devices generally, and specifically at the time of the creation, sending, or receipt of the relevant information pertaining to the offence. This may include collateral information about accounts that were logged in on the device and can be identified to a person, passwords required for access and the user associated with the passwords. The date range for the examination under this category may need to reach farther back in time than for the other categories, because it may be necessary to determine who set up an account months or years earlier, in order to determine who was using the device at the relevant time.
- j. Investigators do not have a detailed understanding of the life Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN led. For example, we do not know who their friends or associates were. We do not know if they have had any enemies. We do not know where they spent their time, or what their interests were.

Justification of Time Frame Being Sought

- 42. Acquiring one (1) month of telephone records will assist officers in establishing the frequency of contact Bernard SHERMAN and Honey SHERMAN had with other persons. This information will be useful in providing objective data as to who they were close to or had frequent contact with. Uncovering the identities of those individuals may provide further witnesses or information in this homicide investigation.
- 43. One (1) month of geolocation data will also assist investigators in determining where the Deceased Persons spent their time, which in turn may be beneficial in determining

their habits and lifestyle, and in particular whether anything changed shortly before their deaths.

SEALING ORDER

44. I am seeking an order pursuant to section 487.3 of the Criminal Code of Canada prohibiting disclosure of information relating to this affidavit and denying access based on the following reasons:

- a. I believe on reasonable grounds that it is necessary that all materials relating to this application be sealed from public view in order to ensure the on-going police investigation is not compromised. In particular, this case has attracted a great deal of media attention. If a suspect is identified and interviewed, it can be very valuable to discover that the suspect knows something that is not already public. This technique is useless if everything is already publicized.
- b. The family of the two deceased have been subjected to heavy media scrutiny which would only get worse if all the details known to police were made public, prejudicing their rights as innocent persons to be left alone.
- c. I reasonably believe that the ends of justice would be subverted by disclosure of information relating to this affidavit, or that the information might be used for an improper purpose, and that the importance in access to the information is outweighed by these concerns.

CONCLUSION

45. In the early stages of this investigation, investigators are trying to uncover pertinent details and evidence that may assist in identifying and uncovering the identities of those individuals who may be witnesses or will have knowledge of and will assist the homicide investigation. Learning who the victims of the offence were in contact with and who their associates were is essential to the progression of this investigation.
